

EQUIPMENT LIST

YOU MUST HAVE:

1. License (s) Archers must have **Archery Stamp**
2. Rifle (s).....or Bow
3. Ammo.....or Arrows
4. Headlamp w/ extra batteries
5. Waterproof (not water repellent) outerwear
6. Waterproof boots (2 pair) suitable for hiking & riding, and clean socks for each day
7. Water bottle, lighters
8. Warm sleeping bag*
* all archery & backcountry hunters only

YOU MIGHT ALSO WANT TO BRING:

1. Binoculars
2. Rangefinder
3. Knife/pocket tool
4. Camera & film
5. Glasses/contacts/solution
6. Any prescription meds
7. Clothes you can layer
8. Baby wipes, unscented*
*backcountry hunters only

Archery hunters in the backcountry:

Archery hunts can be based at the lodge, in the backcountry or a combination of both. Archery hunters in the backcountry will be “spiking out”. This type of camp is great for focusing on nothing but hunting. It means carrying only the barest of essentials and being able to move quickly. Meals will be simple but adequate and be prepared to sleep under the stars.

ARCHERY HUNTERS-PLEASE NOTE: Based on prior experience in real weather conditions we require that you use plastic veins and NOT feather fletching on your arrows.

Lodge hunters:

The cabins have bedding and wood heat. Towels, soap and shampoo are provided in the bathhouse. Meals and snack will be provided along with juices, iced tea, lemonade and coffee. We have a limited selection of beer and soda available for purchase. You are encouraged to bring your own beverage of choice including beer and soda or something stronger if you prefer. These can be purchased before we leave town. You should consider bringing some comfortable clothes for lounging around the lodge in the evening.

Weather:

Archers can expect daytime temps between 50-75 degrees dropping toward freezing at night. Spring bear hunters will likely see similar temps but should anticipate more moisture (snow/sleet/rain). Late season rifle hunters should expect daytime temps from 30-50 degrees with evenings continuing to fall toward zero.

ALL HUNTERS SHOULD:

- be prepared for precipitation and significant changes in temperature.
- bring clothing and gear that can be layered for comfort w/ the outer layers being **waterproof**.
- bring only QUIET clothes and gear**. If it's noisy you'll be asked to leave it at the lodge or camp.
- be using good quality optics on their rifles. No Tasco or comparable models please.
